THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

ORDINARY TIME

The purpose of the Church's liturgical year is to celebrate Christ's saving work and unfold his entire mystery for us throughout the year. After Christmas Time and then after Easter Time we celebrate Ordinary Time. At various points of the year we focus on one aspect of Christ's mystery such as his Resurrection, but in Ordinary Time we honour the whole mystery of Christ and its implications for our life. The colour for Ordinary Time is green which evokes the new growth and hope flowing to us from Christ's Life, Death and Resurrection.

Triumph: the Lenten Program for 2023, contains short daily reflections (from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday) for individual devotional reading. It includes reflections on the Sunday Scripture readings and prayers and questions that customarily form part of Lenten group gatherings.

RIP CARDINAL GEORGE PELL

His Eminence George Cardinal Pell passed away earlier this week in Rome. He was 81 years of age. Ordained priest on 16th December 1966 and appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Melbourne in 1987, he then served as Archbishop of Melbourne from 1996-2001. He was the eighth Archbishop of Sydney. From 2014 he served as Prefect for the Secretariat for the Economy. May Cardinal Pell now rest in the fullness of eternal life.

I did not know him myself, but he who sent me to baptise with water had said to me, "The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and rest is the one who is going to baptise with the Holy Spirit." Yes, I have seen and I am the witness that he is the Chosen One of God.'

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

The Perfume of Holiness

What does it mean to be 'holy'? It does not mean 100% morally correct, or separate from the great mass of people: 'Holier than thou'! It means being so close to God that God's holiness rubs off. We are adopted members of the Holy Family, and something rubs off

Each one of us has heard at our baptism 'You are my beloved son/ daughter'. We have been adopted into God's family and that brings us into close proximity to God.

So, if St Paul were writing to us today, as he did to the Corinthians, this is how it would run: ' ... to the church of God that is in [your town], made up of those who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called holv.'

But, we are not alone. In a multitude of places there are people who have also been baptised and therefore share a certain family resemblance. How is the 'togetherness' held together? By being in communion with the Bishop of Rome, currently Pope Francis. We might pause for a moment to thank God that we are amongst the baptised who can receive St Paul's greeting: 'Grace and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.'
